

How to Start a Business in Arizona

Checklist

1.	Form your business.
	1.1. Review Arizona formation options. \square
	Review the four types of business structures available in Arizona. Choose the
	structure that benefits your business.
	1.2. Name your business. \square
	Brainstorm name ideas, check name availability with the state, and if available,
	register your ideal name with the Arizona Secretary of State.
	1.3. Get an Employer Identification Number. \square
	Apply for an EIN on the IRS website.
	1.4. Register your business in Arizona. \square
	For those starting a partnership, you must complete and file formation papers with
	the Secretary of State. For those starting a corporation or LLC, you'll need to
	complete and file articles of formation with the Arizona Corporation Commission.
	1.5. Obtain necessary permits and licenses. \square
	Contact the License Compliance at License Compliance@azdor.gov or visit your
	city/town/county offices for more licensing information.
2.	Register your business for taxes. \square
	2.1. Register for a transaction privilege tax. \square
	Register for transaction privilege tax with the Arizona Department of Revenue.
	2.2. Register for withholding tax. \square



	Use the Joint Tax Application, Form JT-1 to apply for withholding tax with the
	Department of Revenue.
	2.3. Register for corporation business tax. \square
	Register and pay corporation business tax using the AZTaxes.org website.
3.	Hire employees and report them to the state. \square
	3.1. Go to the Arizona New Hire Reporting Center. \Box
	Within the first 20 days of employment, you must report newly hired employees to
	the Arizona New Hire Reporting Center.
	3.2. Obtain Workers' Compensation Insurance. \square
	Obtain workers' compensation and manage claims on the Industrial Commission
	of Arizona website.
	3.3. Display mandatory posters in your place of business. \square
	Display state-mandated posters in crowded and populated areas.
