	File Articles of Corporation on sunbiz.org and pay the \$70.00 registration fee.

	File Articles of Organization on sunbiz.org and pay the \$125.00 registration fee.		
	2.3. Form a Florida Partnership. □		
	Complete the required forms on sunbiz.org for the type of partnership you want to		
	form and pay the required fees.

		Contact your county's business office and your city's administration for details on
		the applicable rates and how to pay them.

		Register all newly and rehired employees with the Florida Department of
		Revenue.
	5.2.	Keep up with payroll taxes. \square
		Be sure to pay Federal Income Tax Withholding, Social Security, Medicare, and
		Unemployment Insurance.
	5.3.	Apply for Worker's Compensation Insurance. \Box

		forms.
