1.	Form your business. \square
	1.1. Review formation options in Nevada. \square
	There are four basic formatting options; review each and choose the best option
	for your business.
	1.2. Name your business. \square
	Check the availability of your business name on the Nevada Secretary of State
	website and, if available, reserve your name.
	1.3. Get an Employer Identification Number. \square
	Apply for an Employer Identification Number at the IRS.
	1.4. Register your business in Nevada. \square
	Use the SilverFlume Business portal and follow the steps to register your business,
	file the correct articles, and pay the registration form.
2.	Obtain the necessary permits and licenses. \square
	2.1. Register for a Nevada state business license. \square
	Go to the Nevada Secretary of State website and apply online.
	2.2. Find out which industry-specific licenses and permits you need. \Box
	Find all the information and applications you need on the Department of Business
	and Industry website.
	2.3. Obtain a professional license. \square
	If you are in a professional industry, you will need to obtain a license from your
	industry or from the state.
	2.4. Comply with county zoning rules. □

3.	Register your business for taxes \square
	3.1. Register with the Nevada Department of Taxation. \Box
	Use your SilverFlume account (created when registering your business) to register
	3.2. Apply for a sales tax permit. \square
	Use your SilverFlume account to apply, if necessary.
	3.3. Double-check for any other tax requirements. \Box
	Your SilverFlume Business Checklist will tell you which taxes you should register
	for.
4.	Hire employees. □
	4.1. Ensure that you comply with Nevada labor laws. \square
