

How to Start a Business in New Jersey Checklist

1.	Form your business.
	1.1. Review formation options in New Jersey. \square
	There are six main types of business entities in New Jersey. Choose the one that
	suits your business best.
	1.2. Name your business. \square
	After checking to see that your name does not exist, register your business name
	with the New Jersey Treasury Department.
	1.3. Get an employer identification number. \square
	Apply for an EIN with the IRS.
	1.4. Register your business in New Jersey. \square
	Sole proprietorships and general partners do not need to file with the state. LLCs
	and corporations must file online.
	1.5. Obtain necessary permits and licenses. \square
	Check the New Jersey government website to see if your business requires any
	special licenses/permits. If you do, apply for them online.
2.	Register your business for taxes. \square
	2.1. Register for New Jersey state taxes. \square
	Apply for your state taxes at the NJ Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services.
	2.2. File Form NJ-REG. \square
	By filing Form NJ-REG, your business will be registered for applicable taxes and
	related liabilities.
2	Hire employees and report them to the state \Box



3.1.	Go to the New Jersey Employer Services Portal. \square
	Report all new and returning employees online.
3.2.	Obtain Workers' Compensation Insurance. \square
	The insurance must be written by a mutual or stock carrier authorized to write
	insurance in New Jersey.
3.3.	Display mandatory posters in your place of business. \square
	There are 14 mandatory labor law posters in New Jersey, which you can obtain
	from the NJ Department of Labor and Workforce Development.
